# FROM THE PASTOR

The Session is hosting a congregation(al) information Q&A for June 11 after worship in the sanctuary for the purpose of discussing the building project. Below are details leading to the calling of this meeting and the Session Resolution.

The overall balance as of April 16, 2023 for the building project was \$579,875.44. \$532,000 is invested and the remaining \$47,875.44 is in the Funds bank account. January – April 16, 2023 donations received totaled: \$24,065.80. Earnings/Interest: \$1,376.49. Paid expenses: \$26,949.22

Donations prior to May 2021 totaled \$45,498.00. May 2021 to December 2021: \$325,538.66. January 2022 to December 2022: \$161,822.55. January to April 16, 2023: \$24,065.80. Total donations: \$556,925.01.

Total Pledges not received: \$35,558.72. Pledges expected in 2022 but not received: \$24,558.72. Expected in 2023 or later \$11,000.00. New pledge made for 2023: \$80,000.

31 church member units have contributed; some of these have given multiple times and continue giving. 1 youth member contributed. 1 anonymous donor initiated a match (\$100,000.) 38 non-member units have contributed.

Conclusion: May 1, 2023 contract deadline with Point Builders passed without down payment of \$850,000 (which was needed but not raised).

As of April 19, 2023, \$580,000 donations were in hand and \$80,000 in pledge by signing of contract totaling \$630,000, which was \$220,000 below \$850,000 estimate for May 1 weatherproof shell contract. At donation rate of \$150,000 per year (averaging 2020-2023 donations of \$450,000 from May 2020-April 2023) the \$220,000 would take one and a half years

(November 2024) to reach \$850,000 and break ground without considering grants or overage costs. After reaching \$850,000 by November 2024 to finish building (\$550,000) would take three and 2/3 years (July 2028 at current rate of \$150,000 donations per year.)

Alternatively, based on a \$100,000 annual donation projection, we would be ready to sign and then break ground at \$850,000 in July 2025 and reach our \$1,400,000 goal by January 2031. And a third alternative based on a \$75,000 annual goal, we would be ready to sign and then construct at \$850,000 in May 2026 and reach our \$1,400,000 goal by September 2033.

### **SESSION RESOLUTION**

- 1. Thank you to the Expansion Committee that has worked extremely conscientiously and faithfully to accomplish all of the requests, comments, and ideas of the church members. Their task of presenting a proposal and raising donations was done with dignity and enthusiasm in the midst of strenuous economic circumstances.
- 2. Thank you to Point Builders for their work.
- Propose a downsized building in line with the available and pledged donations by scaling back the facility plan, re-group, and continuing forward focusing on the mission outreach to engage community in recreational ministries.
- 4. Match funds with challenge from Vavra Estate up to \$100,000, details and timing to be worked out.

Again, the Session is hosting a congregation information Q&A for June 11 after worship in the sanctuary for the purpose of discussing the building project.

# THE REV. MIROSLAV PFANN VISIT: CONNECTING WITH OUR CZECH ROOTS

For many years Rev. Pfann has been planning a trip to the United States on a sabbatical to study the development of the Czech Brethren Evangelical Churches and the lives of the immigrant descendants. Our church was the first established Czech Protestant Church west of the Mississippi, and we were honored to be included in his research.

God blessed May 10 with perfect spring weather for the tour. We began with the history of our church building and a greeting from Pastor Julie. We shared the church's part in the community's march from our church to Banner Valley Church, commemorating the death of President Lincoln. We viewed locations of the Banner Valley and Rogers Grove Churches and walked through the Rogers Grove Cemetery, observing all the familiar Czech surnames. We drove past farmsteads of pioneer members and then visited our church cemetery. Rev. Pfann was especially interested in the resting places of Rev. Kun and Rev. Pokorny. Rev. Kun founded many Czech churches in many Midwest states, and Rev. Pfann has visited many of those locations. We drove past the West Church location on the Chadimas' property and took a brief tour of the 1890 home and farm. We enjoyed lunch at the Kava House in Swisher, owned by the Vondraceks. Karen Vondracek is related to Rev. Kun. We then returned to the church where many historical documents were on display. Rev. Pfann especially appreciated Book 1 of records of the first members. He recognized many surnames. At 4:00 p.m. descendants of our early church were invited to share memories and ask questions. It was fortunate for us that Rev. Pfann spoke English quite well. Some of our members could speak Czech with him – we even sang a few Czech songs!

Many thank yous need to be listed: Ed Vavra for keeping in contact with Rev. Pfann during the pandemic years and inviting him to come, and

then taking time off work to be our expert tour guide; Barb Horak for meticulously planning our day of touring and historical offerings and making an informative thumb drive for Rev. Pfann to take with him; Karen Zacek for baking - and I quote, "the best kolaches they had on their visit"; Joanne Chadima for organizing, providing the van, and baking rhubarb crisp; Pastor Julie for offering a greeting; for all those who came to spend the time visiting with Rev. Pfann; and to Andy Hasley and Janice Horak for hosting Rev. Pfann.

A note from JoAn Ferguson, Rev. Pfann's chauffeur while in the US: "Can't begin to thank you for the wonderful day you organized for Mirek Pfann's trip to Ely. The day is filled with warm memories of good food, friendly faces, and a wealth of information for him to take home to the Czech Republic. Bless you for all you did to make a day at the Ely Church Possible."

# **CHAIR YOGA**

The chair yoga program is off to a beautiful start. We meet each Wednesday from 11:30 a.m. - 12:30 p.m.

Julie Ellen, RYT-500, teaches the class. She's registered with the Yoga Alliance, a governing professional group for Yoga instructors, and she's achieved the highest certification the Yoga Alliance offers. In addition to her Yoga certification, Julie is a licensed massage therapist. She's well equipped and trained to provide a broad range of exercises for the varying needs of each participant.

Each class begins with basic breathing exercises. Using a mantra helps participants focus on one's self while letting go of intrusive thoughts and outside distractions. While continuing to practice breathing, Julie demonstrates yoga poses, isolating different areas of the body or muscle groups for stretching, firming, and developing more substantial muscles. Near the end of class, while sitting, attention is focused on a mindful meditation while continuing the breathing exercise. Each session is closed with a ritual of thankfulness to classmates and oneself.

Participants have commented on their experience: Wow! I feel so much better; she's having us do exercises my physical therapist does with me; I feel like I stand taller now that I'm attending the class.

For those of you who are hesitant to attend the class out of embarrassment or feeling out-of-shape, please remember we're all friends coming to help ourselves. We're all so focused on ourselves, breathing, and doing the poses; nobody is watching how others may be doing the exercises. Everyone does the activities according to their physical ability and not somebody else's. This class is for you, your health, and your wellbeing.


# SUMMERTIME MISSION FOR HUNGRY KIDS

# **ELEVATOR**




