## SESSION NOTES

### AUGUST 20, 2020 VIA ZOOM VIDEO CONFERENCE



The August 10 derecho left church property without electricity or water August 10-16. Manse property continued without electricity August 16-24. Initial insurance assessment made on August 17 with damage to building and shed roofs, damage in cemetery including two broken gravestones, two shifted gravestones, destroyed back porch door, minor siding damage to buildings, two church road signs snapped off, downed trees and limbs throughout, and some personal property damage of pastor's family.

Fourth grade Bibles will be presented in September.

Motion approved to invest the Water's Estate into an 18-month CD with 0.35% interest and the Skripsky, Hynek and Modracek estates into the Funds checking account. Motion approved to renew the \$10,000 Adult Education CD (maturing on September 9) with 0.35% for 18-month term.

Discussion concerning refreshments after worship. Refreshments can be served (not self-serve) with social distancing and additional cautions.

Presbyterian Disaster Assistance will be making a grant to the Presbytery of East Iowa for Derecho assistance. Our congregation may qualify.

The One Great Hour of Sharing offering was taken and blessed on July 26. School supply special donation were collected and donated locally.

The Custodial position has been filled by Dawn Zacek, who will begin her duties September 1, 2020. Pat Kilberger will continue bathroom and hall cleaning until Dawn takes over. Thank you, Pat!

Property – Second road treatment has been done. A lot of trees were down after the big storm, most have been cleaned up. There is still one

large tree limb in the playground area and Pat wants parents to caution their children. Two of our church road signs came down in the storm. The fascia on the church has been repaired by Dan Manders. Thank you to all the volunteers for hard work in cleaning up cemetery, church, and manse properties.

Safety and security guidelines are being investigated.

A survey will be conducted concerning worship and education to present to Session on September 10 meeting. Until that time, outside services will continue.

Youth Group has met by Zoom video conference for lessons and one boating outing. The meeting at Dan and Debbie's for ice cream was cancelled due to the derecho. A can collection is underway for the youth group fund.

Other Business – Soup Supper: After much discussion, the motion approved to have drive-through frozen soup and packaged kolaches. Online and phone orders by late September.

## CONGREGATIONAL MEETING

A Congregational meeting will most likely be scheduled for October 25. Details to follow about format. Agenda items: Election of new church officers and financial update.

## **REOPENING PROTOCOL AT FIRST PRESBYTERIAN CHURCH NEAR ELY (as of 10/1/20)**

Staff, Members, and Guests: Anyone age 65 or older, or with serious underlying health conditions are encouraged to talk to their healthcare provider to assess their risk and to determine if they should stay home. If they are sick, then they should stay at home. Facebook live streaming will continue for worship and Wednesday morning Bible study. Sunday School and Youth Group opportunities will continue online and outdoors as possible.

For Worship:

1. Entering the building
  - a. Hand sanitizers will be located by each doorway.
  - b. Face masks will be worn.
2. In Sanctuary
  - a. Family, couple, or individual sit 2 pews apart, minimum 6 feet from neighbors
  - b. Offering in plates in back entrance. Donations are encouraged through electronic donation.
  - c. Bulletins will also be sent electronically for usage on digital devices.
  - d. Communion will be served by prepackaged kits distributed by masked and gloved Elder at beginning of worship service.
3. Restrooms: disinfect available and encouraged for each person's usage.
4. Fellowship time limited after worship (no self-serve.)
5. Regular cleaning and disinfecting of hard surfaces--before and after people enter and exit building with CDC approved procedures and disinfectants.
6. Sunday School activities will be outdoors with activities with built in social distancing. When the weather becomes

prohibitive, Sunday School will meet in the church living room and youth room with social distancing.

Procedure when COVID-19 has been reported by a member, guest, or staff within the building:

1. Church will contact all who were in the building on the date(s) by email or phone call.
2. Continue disinfectant practices in cleaning.
3. Church building will close if notification is within 2-week self-quarantine/isolation time frame and risk of contact deems prudent.

Posted at entryways at church:

Please evaluate how you are feeling before entering. If you have any of the following symptoms, please do not attend today:

- Cough
- Shortness of breath or difficulty breathing
- Chills
- Repeated shaking with chills
- Muscle pain
- Headache
- Sore throat
- Loss of taste or smell
- Diarrhea
- Feeling feverish or having a temperature greater than or equal to 100.0 degrees F
- Known Close contact with a person who is lab-confirmed to have COVID-19
- Traveled outside USA in the last two weeks
- Traveled on an airplane in the last two weeks

Wear a mask.

Practice social distancing.

Thank you for watching out for each other.

## FROM THE CENTERS FOR DISEASE CONTROL AND PREVENTION (CDC, 9-23-20)

Fall Holiday Celebrations will likely need to be different this fall to prevent the spread of the virus that causes COVID-19. Avoid activities that are higher risk for spread. Consider fun alternatives that pose lower risk of spreading the virus that causes COVID-19.

Halloween: Many traditional Halloween activities can be high-risk for spreading viruses. There are several safer, alternative ways to participate in Halloween. If you may have COVID-19 or you may have been exposed to someone with COVID-19, you should not participate in in-person Halloween festivities and should not give out candy to trick-or-treaters.

Lower risk activities. These lower risk activities can be safe alternatives:

- Carving or decorating pumpkins with members of your household and displaying them
- Carving or decorating pumpkins outside, at a safe distance, with neighbors or friends
- Decorating your house, apartment, or living space
- Doing a Halloween scavenger hunt where children are given lists of Halloween-themed things to look for while they walk outdoors from house to house admiring Halloween decorations at a distance
- Having a virtual Halloween costume contest
- Having a Halloween movie night with people you live with
- Having a scavenger hunt-style trick-or-treat search with your household members in or around your home rather than going house to house

Moderate risk activities.

- Participating in one-way trick-or-treating where individually wrapped goodie bags are lined up for families to grab and go while continuing to social distance (such as at the end of a driveway or at the edge of a yard)
- If you are preparing goodie bags, wash your hands with soap and water for at least 20 second before and after preparing the bags.
- Having a small group, outdoor, open-air costume parade where people are distanced more than 6 feet apart

- Attending a costume party held outdoors where protective masks are used and people can remain more than 6 feet apart
- A costume mask (such as for Halloween) is not a substitute for a cloth mask. A costume mask should not be used unless it is made of two or more layers of breathable fabric that covers the mouth and nose and doesn't leave gaps around the face.
- Do not wear a costume mask over a protective cloth mask because it can be dangerous if the costume mask makes it hard to breathe. Instead, consider using a Halloween-themed cloth mask.
- Going to an open-air, one-way, walk-through haunted forest where appropriate mask use is enforced, and people can remain more than 6 feet apart
- If screaming will likely occur, greater distancing is advised. The greater the distance, the lower the risk of spreading a respiratory virus.
- Visiting pumpkin patches or orchards where people use hand sanitizer before touching pumpkins or picking apples, wearing masks is encouraged or enforced, and people are able to maintain social distancing
- Having an outdoor Halloween movie night with local family friends with people spaced at least 6 feet apart.
- Lower your risk by following CDC's recommendations on hosting gatherings or cook-outs.

Higher risk activities. Avoid these higher risk activities to help prevent the spread of the virus that causes COVID-19:

- Participating in traditional trick-or-treating where treats are handed to children who go door to door
- Having trunk-or-treat where treats are handed out from trunks of cars lined up in large parking lots
- Attending crowded costume parties held indoors
- Going to an indoor haunted house where people may be crowded together and screaming
- Going on hayrides or tractor rides with people who are not in your household
- Using alcohol or drugs, which can cloud judgement and increase risky behaviors
- Traveling to a rural fall festival that is not in your community if you live in an area with community spread of COVID-19

Hello from Youth Group!

Youth and teachers began school in late August/early

September, amid many questions and much anxiety about returning while COVID continues. At the writing of this message, many students are going to “in class” learning while others are doing “at home” learning and for some it is a combination hybrid of the two styles. We ask that you join us and continue to pray for God's protection for the safety of all students, teachers, paras, bus drivers, counselors, parents and administration as school continues in this uncertain time.
