FROM THE PASTOR

AMAZING GRACE HYMN AND SERIES

John Newton composed the words to the poem "Amazing Grace" 250 years ago. This fall we will examine what is so amazing about grace in a sermon series started at the end of September and continuing through October.

Hymnary.org says this about "Amazing Grace."

If America had a national folk hymn, this would probably be it. This well-loved and oft-sung hymn, written by John Newton in the late eighteenth century, is a powerful assurance and declaration of the grace of God working in all our lives. When Newton was just eleven, he joined his father at sea and began a tumultuous life in the Navy, eventually becoming captain of a slave ship. In a period of four years, however, his life was drastically turned around: he nearly drowned, he married a very pious Mary Catlett, and he read through Thomas à Kempis' Imitation of Christ. In 1754 he gave up the slave trade and joined forces with the great abolitionist, William Wilberforce. A number of years later, he was ordained for ministry, and soon after wrote this great text, declaring that we are saved only by the grace of God. Newton wrote, "I can see no reason why the Lord singled me out for mercy...unless it was to show, by one astonishing instance, that with him 'nothing is impossible'" (Newton, The Life of John Newton). As we sing the very familiar words of this hymn, how powerful it is to think of

ourselves as an "astonishing instance" of God's grace and mercy.

Amazing grace how sweet the sound that saved a wretch like me! I once was lost, but now am found, was blind, but now I see.

2 'Twas grace that taught my heart to fear, and grace my fears relieved; how precious did that grace appear the hour I first believed!

3 Through many dangers, toils, and snares I have already come: 'tis grace has brought me safe thus far, and grace will lead me home.

4 The Lord has promised good to me, his word my hope secures; he will my shield and portion be as long as life endures.

5 Yes, when this flesh and heart shall fail, and mortal life shall cease:
I shall possess, within the veil, a life of joy and peace.

6 The earth shall soon dissolve like snow, the sun forbear to shine; but God, who called me here below, will be forever mine.

What do you see in the verses that is missing? What is amazing about grace to you? Let's explore it together.

EXPANSION PROJECT

The Session is pleased to announce that a groundbreaking date has been set for April 7 at 11:00 a.m. Plans are being finalized and what remains to construct and equip the ministry L.I.F.E. Center is \$92,000 (out of the \$900,000 budget).

SESSION NOTES FROM JULY 20, 2023

- 1. Worship attendance in person/live streaming: June 4: 42/5; June 11: 47/3; June 18: 48/5; June 25: 42/4
- 2. Church Membership: 177
- 3. Presentation by Darin Foreman of Foreman Construction regarding the building expansion. His presentation consisted of pricing based on subcontractor input, current similar projects, and floor plan. Also included was a rendering of the proposed facility. Darin was recommended by Randy Zbanek from Harger Acoustics. Estimated pricing \$900,000 (\$180.20 per square foot.)
- 4. Treasurer's Report: General Fund ending month balance of \$(3,624.48)
 Per Capita 40.3% of budget (YTD Actual of \$1,008.10 on budget of \$2,500.00)
 Regular Offering-Pledged 39.1% of budget (YTD actual of \$39,759.36 on budget of \$101,718.00)
 Regular Offering-non-pledged 23.2% of budget (YTD actual of \$15,383.46 on budget of \$66,311.00)
- Funds Report: Phil Huedepohl presented Vanguard Process to make securities and stock gifts to the church. Motion approved.
- There are several CD's that are maturing in August. Motion approved to roll over CD's.
- 7. Mission-\$2,300.00 was electronically transferred for Camino Mission in Czech Republic to Ukraine (\$500.00 from Budget, \$350.00 from March donations & \$1,450.00 collected in May). Linn Food Bank had 73 items donated.
- Property- Church west wing air conditioner replaced with a price reduction of \$600.00.
 The elevator final payment (\$12,855) has not been made yet as a gasket needs to be installed.
