FROM THE PASTOR

from August 16, 2020 Sermon

Matthew 7:24-27

Jesus said, "Anyone who listens to my teaching and obeys me is wise, like a person who builds a house on solid rock. Though the rain comes in torrents and the floodwaters rise and the winds beat against that house, it won't collapse, because it is built on rock. But anyone who hears my teachings and ignores it is foolish, like a person who builds a house on sand. When the rains and floods come and winds beat against that house, it will fall with a mighty crash."

...in the past week we have experienced a Derecho with uprooted trees, tipped over RV's, holes in roofs, garage doors blown in, flattened fields, battered barns, tired spirits, destroyed homes.

Usually, we look to nature to see the glory of God and the goodness of creation, but this week we mourn the loss of beloved trees and livelihoods lying flat in the field, of opportunities lost, and hope blown asunder.

We are saddened because we are still amid a pandemic and all we want to do is to hug one another for comfort and support.

We are shocked by our dependency on electricity and gasoline, on wi-fi and air conditioning.

We are overwhelmed by tearing down the remains of decades old bins, outbuildings, windbreaks, and watering livestock, and remembering planting trees with grandparent or child and now seeing them in ruin.

And, we wonder: If God is punishing us? And, how much more can we take?

We are being tested. Tested by our circumstances, by the rough elements of life—wind, rain, destruction. God, as our teacher, creator, source, and guide, as a parent --is cheering us on. Willing us to succeed. Our source of stability and eternity.

Today, we look hard at our lives and ask ourselves, have we built our life upon the metaphorical rock, or has it been built on the sand?

What Jesus is talking about in his comparison here—building on sand or on rock was more than figurative. In Palestine, summer shows calm sandy places sheltered by nearby hills. But in the winter—the rainy season—they can become mad rushes of water and the rain from the hills fills the dry beds and becomes a danger. It is when the rains come that it is dangerous when the house is built on the wrong place, and the house is not built correctly with strong foundations anchored deep enough. Tragedy. As Tom Silva from "This Old House" has said, "Without a good foundation, you're sunk."

We not only have to build our lives in a good, healthy, carefully chosen location, we also, have to build our lives with deeply and spiritually grounded foundations.

Poured, block, crawl, slab, steel-reinforced walls and footings—there are all types of foundations, those are choices, and Jesus reminds us to be sure to build our lives on him as the cornerstone, the chief foundation stone.. As Paul says in Ephesians 2:20: "Together we are his house, built on the foundation of the apostles and the prophets. And the cornerstone in Christ Jesus himself."

Some might say that we had a "Come to Jesus" moment this week.

And in that moment, what did you discover?
What is important to you? And where are your
footings? What is the steel that reinforces you?

Know that as clear as the sky is when the
electricity is off, we can see beyond our
momentary affliction to a greater and bigger
universe.

Know that memory and experience of God's
mercy can buoy you on the day of rough times.

Know that the presence of neighbor, friend,
family member shows the grace of God when we
need it the most.

Know that Spirit of God who hovered over the
chaotic waters of creation abides with you.

Know that you are loved and live in the
protection, direction, and eternal rescue of our
Lord Jesus the Christ.

JULY 16, 2020 Zoom

SESSION MEETING



Session met via video conferencing. Worship has begun outside with FM broadcasting and on lawn chairs. Attendance: July 5: 65 in person and 27 log in on Facebook live streaming. July 12: 45 in person and 19 log on Facebook live streaming. Membership remains at 196.

Treasurer's Report – financial info through June 30, 2020. (6 months into the year/50% of the way through).

General Fund	ending month balance of \$25,377.65
Per Capita	43.1% of budget (YTD actual \$1,097.00 on budget of \$2,546.00)
Reg offering-pledged	43.9% of budget (YTD actual \$45,683.40 on budget of \$104,164.00)
Reg offering-Non-pledged	22.5% of budget (YTD actual \$10,556.87 on budget of \$46,851.00)

Dan also included an accounting of how the PPP loan money (\$21,170.00) was used. (the numbers were based on 2019 information). Next step is to submit loan forgiveness paperwork.

Virtual VBS is in the month of July with two sessions-- morning and night. First Wednesday 8 students, second Wednesday: 15.

One Great Hour of Sharing offering will be dedicated July 26. A school supply drive will be in late July-early August.

Motion approved to send \$250.00 to the Solon Food Pantry.

The first Sunday of July saw good donations for the food pantry.

Job description for the custodial position was discussed. Search open through early August.

Property – Bugs have been sprayed – in and out. Pat has been keeping up on the cleaning.

Safety and Security – Research and creation of a task force to prioritize for this year on what needs to be done and the resources needed.

Welcoming and Evangelism – Getting the word out to the community about “Drive-In” worship on Sunday mornings.

Worship – We’ve had a nice variety of music this summer. Communion scheduled for July 26. We will continue worship service as we have been doing until further notice.

Youth Report – Sunday virtual video and outside meeting Sunday and Wednesday, seems to be going well.

COMMUNITY & OUTREACH

“SOUP SUPPER” DRIVE-IN PICK-UP – 2020: October 2nd and 3rd

The dates are set, but watch for changes to a few minor details. I needed to get information in the Salt Shaker to start preparing, so keep checking the website and e-mails about our “Soup Supper” event.

Here is the plan: We will only sell quarts of frozen soup and freshly baked kolaches that have been preordered by September 27. That will help us organize orders for an efficient distribution. Our fantastic secretary, Stephanie, will be in charge of the advertising and ordering details. She is a computer whiz, so if you have sites to suggest for posting or advertising ideas – please contact her at:

All kolaches will be made at the church on **October 2, 6 a.m. to noon** and **October 3, 6 a.m. to noon**. We are working on a way to bake safely distanced at the church. All soup will be made ahead of time and frozen for sale.

Drive-in pick-up will be **Friday, October 2 from 3-6 p.m.** and **Saturday, October 3 from 3-6 p.m.** The pre-orders will be taken at the Ely Fall Festival on September 26, so final deadline on September 27. Kolaches \$12 per dozen and Soup \$8 per quart. Payment can be made with cash, check, or credit card.

My big mistake for the year was moving the date to October 2 & 3. It was tentatively scheduled for October 10 at the Annual Meeting. This was due to the Universities’ football scheduling. WELL, there is no football season this year!!! So, my goof works out for October 2 & 3 for most – my apologies to those who have conflicts because of my rescheduling.

What a year – it seems that everything has changed. We will not have any guests served in our church, we will not have any live music, we will not need members to make kolaches or soup at home, we will not need dish washers or table servers, or all the extra food we generously provide, and we will not have a Country Store.

What can you do? Please advertise our preorder – pick-up event!!!! Post cards available at the church

for you to send or pass out. **Volunteer** to help our soup makers (date/place TBD). **Volunteer** to come to the church to bake (will need extra packaging people) – we will follow Covid rules. Please **donate** fillings – only baking: cherry, apricot, poppy seed, a few prune, strawberry and peach (leave fillings on table in basement). Please **volunteer** to take orders out to the cars, a new job and **really need** quite a few for each night.
